1. CALL TO ORDER

Mayor Rowe called the meeting to order at 1:03 p.m.

2. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

3. Resolution 11-2015 A RESOLUTION DECLARING THE CITY OF COQUILLE'S CENTRAL BLVD IS IN A CONDITION DETRIMENTAL TO PUBLIC SAFETY, IS IN NEED OF REPAIR, IS NOT PART OF THE STATE HIGHWAY SYSTEMS, IS UNDER JURISDICTION AND CONTROL OF THE CITY. WE RESPECTFULLY REQUEST THAT THE OREGON TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION CONSIDER AND DECLARE THAT SAID STREET AS QUALIFIED FOR REPAIR AND THE CITY HEREBY TO PLEDGE COMPLETE COOPERATION AND ASSISTANCE TO THE END AND REQUEST TO SHARE AND PARTICIPATE IN THE USE AND BENEFIT OF THE SPECIAL CITY ALLOTMENT FUND AND APPROPRIATION AND DOES DESIGNATE BEN MARCHANT AS THE OFFICIAL REPRESENTATIVE OF THE CITY.

Finance Director Dufner said the City applies for the Special City Allotment Grant from the Oregon Transportation Commission to help with the repairs of streets. This year we are applying to help with the expense of repairing Central Boulevard.

Councilor Chappell made a motion to adopt resolution 11-2015 A Resolution declaring the City of Coquille's Central BLVD is in a condition detrimental to public safety, is in need of repair, is not part of the state highway systems, is under jurisdiction and control of the City. We respectfully request that the Oregon Transportation Commission consider and declare that said street as qualified for repair and the City hereby to pledge complete cooperation and assistance to the end and request to share and participate in the use and benefit of the special city allotment fund and appropriation and does designate Ben Marchant as the official representative of the City . Councilor Wiese seconded the motion, all voted in favor.
